#### **Lis Dyson-Jones**

On Monday the 17th April Lis Dyson-Jones, the valued Chair and committee member of Cardiff Unitarians, resigned from her position. Long-term friend and fellow committee member, Sarah Boyce, expressed: "huge thanks to Lis who has played a very active role in supporting me as a friend and fellow committee member of CU through many transitions over the last 23 years" and notes that "Lis has been very generous and hard working in the time and effort that she has given to the Committee and Congregation in her efficient and intelligent way". Minister at the time, Stephen Lingwood, wished to thank Lis for her service, and express his personal appreciation for the "support and love and care and generosity as we have all worked out this time of transition". On Sunday 30th April, Stephen Lingwood delivered his final online service as minister of Cardiff Unitarians. On the 16th April a farewell tea party was held at the meeting house, to acknowledge and celebrate all that Stephen has done for Cardiff Unitarians, and wish him well in continuing his valuable work around Cardiff. After a moving final speech, former Chair Lis concluded with: "I could go on thanking you; as our minister and as a friend but I'm so grateful that your life has touched us all".

Some may remember Gwynn as "being a quiet and very intelligent presence who as Chair and Committee member had a wise contribution to make to discussions" (Sarah Boyce, 2023). It's with sadness that we share that on the 19th March Gwynn passed away. Gwynn's funeral service at the Cardiff and Glamorgan Crematorium, Barry, was led by the Rev. Eric Jones on Wednesday 12th April to celebrate his life. The chapel was packed full of family, friends, University colleagues, Unitarians and ex work colleagues amongst others.

#### Unitarians attend 'The Big One'
