CU Representatives Attend Leadership Talk

Representatives of four of the South East Wales District congregations met on Saturday 21st October to discuss their current situation in terms of leadership. This meeting, organized by the District Executive Committee in gave an opportunity to speak of difficulties, their individual situation and of intentions for the future. (Two congregations were unable to send a representative and one congregation opted out of the discussion as they have their own Minister) There were two representatives from Cardiff Unitarians.

Discussion took place on whether any kind of district Leadership could be possible or desirable. Many issues were raised from overwork by some, building problems, lack of technical expertise,

marketing Unitarianism locally, communication, financial restraints and the need to recognize today's society problems and not rely on volunteers to solve every problem.

There were some positive suggestions and it was clear that while some congregations are in a dilemma as to recognize how they might move forward, one congregation has bitten the bullet and embraced many of the challenges it faces. All of our congregations are vulnerable in terms of numbers.

Congregations were invited to discuss and decide to go forward or not with a proposal to employ a District Administer/Enabler to assist with various issues and that a brief statement to this effect is sent to the District Secretary by 6th November so that the Executive Committee can assess the opinions of congregations. (Notes of points raised and taken at a very long meeting will be sent to Churches/chapels and further information will be communicated from the District Executive Secretary)
