Welcome

March is another busy month for many faiths; from Holi celebrated by Hindus and Jains, (the colourful Spring festival often recognised by the throwing of powdered dyes), to the equally colourful and spirited Sikh festival of Hola Mohalla. Within Abrahamic religions, Christians observing lent are joined in their fasting by their Muslim friends, when Ramadan (commemorating the month the Qur'an was first revealed to the Prophet Muhammad) begins on the 11th. However, whilst Muslims will continue their fast into early April, Christians will end theirs three days before Easter Sunday, on Maundy Thursday, which commemorates the Last Supper before the crucifixion of Jesus.

The resurrection of Jesus mimics the cycle of the seasons; with the end of winter and the 'resurrection' of the sun (the light) as the days become longer. This is celebrated by Pagans with the festival of Ostara (which falls on the Spring Equinox), which this year is on the 20th. This is a time of awakening, of new life, and growth.


